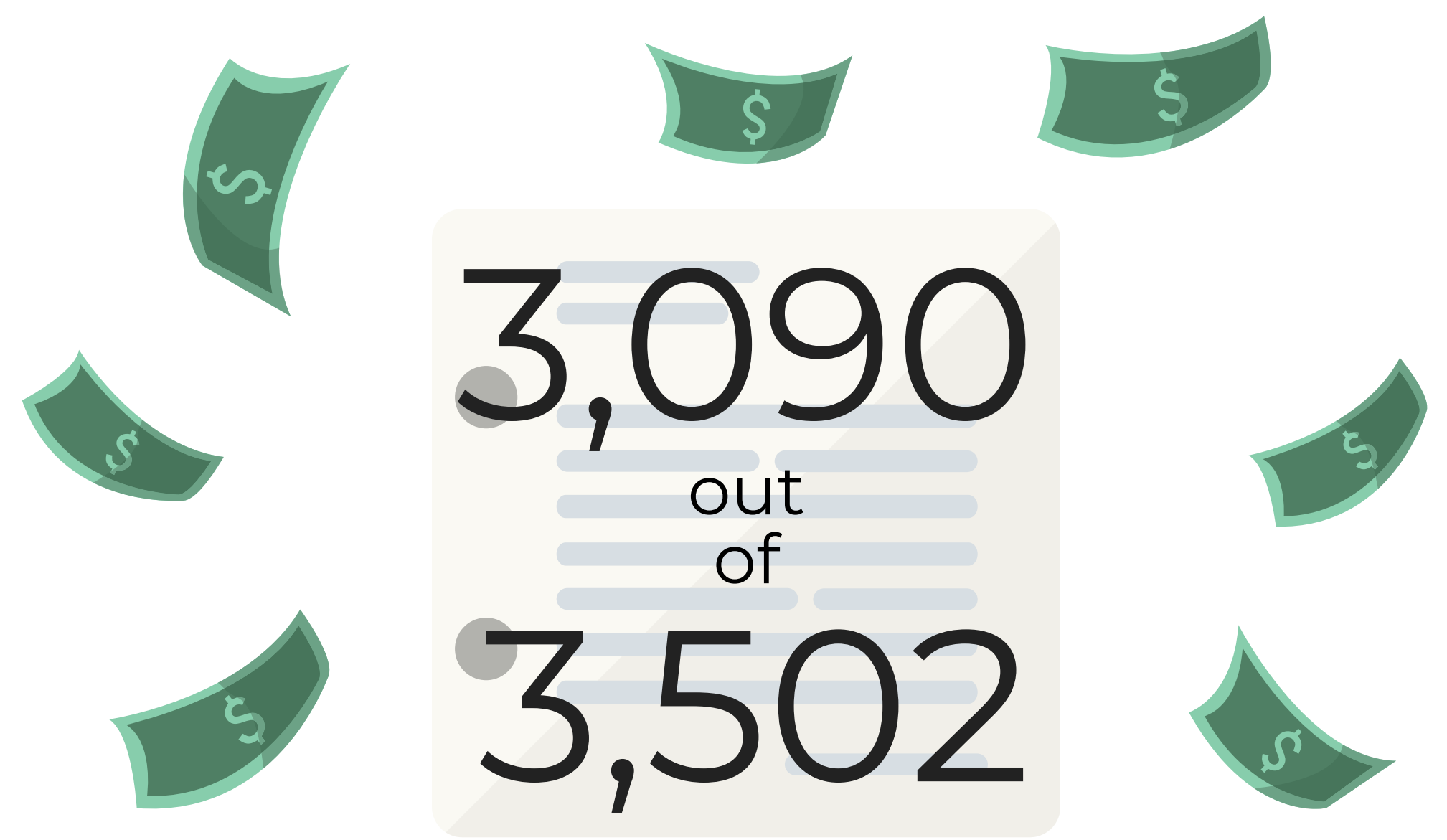

of government-funded research is **closed**, therefore inaccessible to most New Zealanders

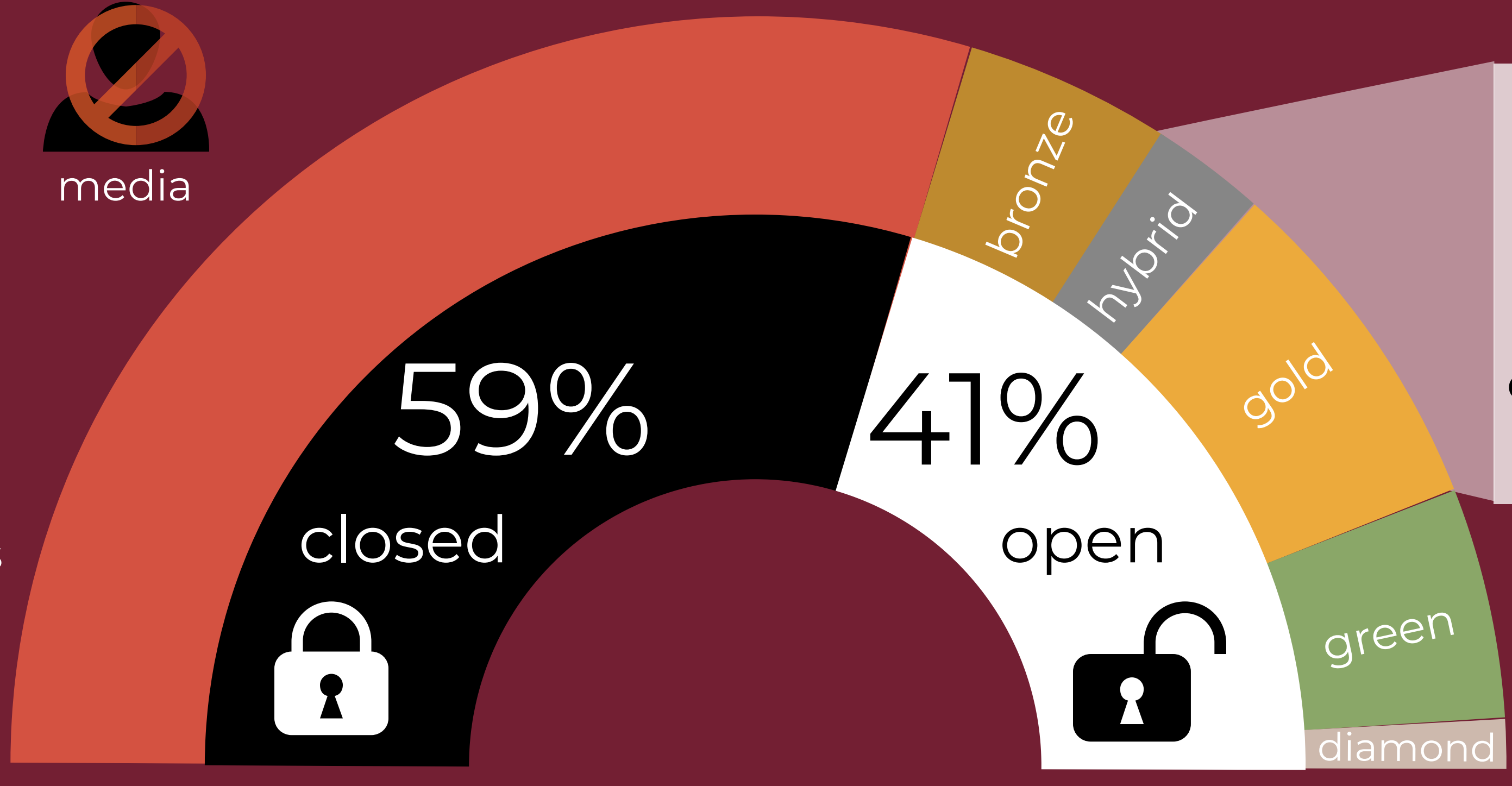


of NZ university researchers would support a policy that allows for "publicly funded scholarly research and/or data to be made freely available online" (2018 Ithaka Survey)



of closed articles² could be made free to readers by publishing with gold or hybrid access at an approximate cost of **NZ\$11 million**. A better solution is to make these articles openly available through repositories **without any publishers charges**
